THINGS TO DO:

All people not resident in Sicily who enter the Sicilian territory have the mandatory obligation to register on www.siciliasicura.com, check in through the web app, or the connected smartphone app, and update their own state of health in the event of the appearance of flu symptoms.



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THINGS TO DO:

In case of clinical urgency or need for technical support, users can refer to the toll-free number 800458787.

Anyone with flu symptoms is however strongly recommended to stay home and self-isolate from their cohabitants.

The report of symptoms sent via app will be examined by a doctor in charge who will initiate the health protocol deemed most appropriate in the specific circumstance.



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WHAT ELSE?

Travelling rules vary, depending on the country of origin or destination and the reasons for travelling.

Measures to counteract and contain the spread of the Covid-19 virus have been extended until 7 October.

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Students coming from EU Countries (except for Croatia, Greece, Malta, Spain, Romania and Bulgaria), Schengen, United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, Andorra, Principality of Monaco

Movements to/from EU countries (except for Romania and Bulgaria) are allowed without the need of justification, therefore also for tourism, and without the obligation of isolation on return provided that you have not transited or stayed in territories out from this list in the 14 days prior to entering Italy.

Students coming from Croatia, Greece, Malta, Spain or who have transited from a country of this list in the past 14 days must also:

a) present a certificate of a negative result at the swab test(PCR) done within maximum 72 hours before entering the national territory;(Strongly advised especially if your plane is not direct, by this way you will avoid 48 hours isolation after arrival)

or

b) they will receive a swab(free of charge) at the airport, port, or border location (where possible) or within 48 hours of entering the national territory at the reference local health unit. If you don't get a swab at the airport you have to write by e-mail to dipprevenzione@asppalermo.org.

As it is better to send an email in italian ask to an ESN member for help. After the swab you have to stay isolated for 48 hours. If you don't get any call from the doctors after the first 48 hours you are free,as it means your swab was negative. You have to reach the place of isolation by private transport/TAXI.

Students coming from Bulgaria and Romania

At your arrival to Italy, there is the obligation of fiduciary isolation and health surveillance (14 days); it is necessary to fill in a self-declaration, and it is possible to reach the final destination in Italy only by private transport/taxi(airport transit is allowed, without leaving the dedicated areas of the terminal).

You have to declare your isolation to the Dipartimento Prevenzione of the local ASP (dipprevenzione@asppalermo.org). As it's better to write the email in italian ask to an ESN Member to help you with it. As a consequence of your mail you will be on health surveillance and if you have no symptoms during this period you will be free after 14 days.

Students coming from Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia

A ban on entry from these countries is still in force, except for EU citizens (including Italian citizens) and their family members who have been resident in Italy since before 16 July 2020.

When returning/arriving to Italy from these countries, it is necessary to undergo fiduciary isolation and health surveillance (14 days), to fill in a self-declaration in which it is compulsory to indicate the reason for the return (possession of EU/Schengen citizenship or condition of a family member of EU citizen and residence in Italy). It is possible to reach the final destination in Italy only by private transports/taxi (airport transit is allowed, without leaving the dedicated areas of the airport).

Rest of the world

Travel to/from the rest of the world is allowed only for precise reasons, such as work, health or study reasons, absolute urgency, return to home, home, or residence. Therefore, travel for tourism is not allowed. The return to Italy from this group of countries is always permitted to Italian/EU/Schengen citizens and their family members, as well as holders of residence permits and their family members.

Upon return/arrival to Italy from these countries, it is necessary to undergo fiduciary isolation and health surveillance and to fill in a self-declaration where it is compulsory to indicate the reason for the return. It is possible to reach the final destination in Italy only by private transport/taxi (airport transit is allowed, without leaving the dedicated areas of the airport).
